BURGUNDY - AN OVERVIEW

Burgundy is the most fascinating wine producing region in the world. Interest is forever on the rise leading to unprecedented demand at a time when recent, successive vintages have produced disappointingly low yields.

This region in eastern France provides the wine enthusiast with the greatest of highs and the lowest of lows. Each vineyard, be they village, Premier Cru or Grand Cru is in the ownership of many different growers, each with their own winemaking style, often handed down from generation to generation. One of the most famous of all Grand Crus, the Clos de Vougeot, is currently in the hands of over 80 proprietors, not all of whom make their own wine.

Purchasing Burgundy is very different from that of Bordeaux, where each Château produces the same wine made by the same winemaker or winemaking team. In Burgundy, following the growers is the primary rule. The top growers produce wine that can be truly sensational; subtle, complex, elegant, yet with restrained power - all great characteristics of the very temperamental Pinot Noir grape. Sadly, there is a multitude of growers who trade on the famous names of the vineyards, in which they are fortunate to have inherited a few rows of vines. They demand ridiculous prices for wines that are simply not up to the mark.

The age old saying “a good bottle of Burgundy costs at least £100” is still very true today - you have to take into account the amount you have wasted on poor to mediocre wine before you find the truly sensational, (bear in mind this saying was introduced when £100 was worth a lot more than it is today).

Selection is the key word when purchasing Burgundy. At the end of each year we spend a week in the region assessing the wines of the previous vintage, many often still in barrel, to decide which wines we are going to buy. A year never goes by without major disappointments and, fortunately, unexpected surprises.



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WHY BUY BURGUNDY “EN PRIMEUR”?

The simple answer is that it is the only way to guarantee that you secure the particular wines that you would like to add to your cellar. It is easier to find top Bordeaux Châteaux on the market five to ten years after release than small Burgundian domaines, where so little wine is actually produced in the first place. Furthermore, Burgundy has suffered from low yields for a number of years. The 2015 vintage was even smaller than the low yielding 2014, and the unprecedented demand for Burgundy has led to a serious availability problem.

Also the wines of Burgundy, and particularly the wines of Chablis and the Mâconnais, are ready for drinking very early, so your money is not tied up for too long.

En Primeur is often seen as a way of investing to make money. It is true that good returns have been made from investing in wine in the past. It can be free of CGT if you sell your wine in the future, which is always nice.

However, our view of En Primeur is slightly different, in that we see the primary reason as being that of securing your supply of highly sought after wines at the lowest possible price. The wine can be stored in our bonded warehouse in Melton, or you can store it in your own cellar when it arrives into the UK. When a wine is ready for drinking it is often hard to find on the open market and you end up paying a hefty price for it. Buying En Primeur solves that problem and, more importantly, you are fully convinced of the wine's provenance.



2015 - THE GROWING SEASON

Recent years have shown Burgundy at its very best – individual, inspirational and exhilarating. Each vintage produces wines of great individual character, showing the diversity and expression of the various appellations. The weather has been the dominant factor over the past few years, causing havoc in some areas and leaving many Burgundians in difficult financial circumstances. Time for some respite and at last Mother Nature showed her kindness.

The winter of 2014-2015 would ideally have been colder to kill off the bugs but it was at least wet, providing much needed water reserves for the year ahead. This proved to be crucial given the high temperatures experienced during the summer growing season.

The bud break was a little earlier than usual in April, due to the mild weather conditions. May was uneventful but mainly dry. The flowering took place around the 25th May and was very successful, both even and swift, over a short ten day period.

In June the weather was fine with some well received rain refreshing the grapes before temperatures started to rise. The month of July was extremely hot with a three week heat wave so intense that the vines began to stress and growth stalled. By now the worry was that the high temperatures could block the 'veraison' (the onset of ripening when the grapes begin to change colour) so canopy management was all important with little leaf removal to avoid burning the grapes. By now it was the hottest summer since 2003.

Thankfully in August rains arrived giving much needed refreshment to the vines and allaying fears of a repeat of 2003. The grapes continued to ripen, the thick skins a notable result of the hot summer weather.

Harvest started in late August for the Chardonnay, followed by the Pinot Noir in early September, the fruit perfectly ripe and in pristine condition. All was set for a great vintage, particularly for the Pinot Noir



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2015 - THE WINES

By the time the harvest was complete and the grapes were in the press house, the vigneronns knew that they had achieved everything in the vineyard that is required to produce a great vintage. There was a palpable excitement and even astonishment at how perfect the grapes really were. Selection was not at all difficult, if needed at all. Michel Lafarge commented simply – “Magnifique”

As in previous vintages, yields were small in certain areas. Although the fruit was very healthy, the bunches were very tight and the grapes were very small with thick skins and hence less juice. In many instances, yields were reduced by up to 40% compared to a normal vintage. (although what is a normal vintage these days?) Charles Lachaux says he suffered reductions of up to 50% in some crus.

The upside of course, is that such fruit concentration has produced some astounding wines.

The white wines were a little more challenging than the reds; however the vigneronns seem to have learnt the lessons of previous hot vintages such as 2003, 2005 and 2009. The harvest for the Chardonnay took place in late August in order to capture the freshness and acidities. The grapes were ripe and high in sugar with a lower level of malic acid than normal. It has to be said that some left it a little too late and the resulting wines are somewhat overblown – these we have left well alone.

Domaines such as Michelot and Lamy have performed exceptionally well, although we now expect that of such top domaines, the latter particularly benefiting from the cooler, higher altitude vineyards preserving the freshness.

Further north in Chablis, a pre harvest storm in the early hours of the 1st September threatened an excellent vintage. As the threat of rot increased it became a race against time to complete the harvest, however by then the fruit was already ripe and a very strict selection process has ensured that some super wines have been produced. The following 2016 vintage has seen drastic yield reductions and increased pricing, so for the Chablis lover we would recommend covering strongly your future requirements.

The Pinot Noir was harvested during the first week of September, just as the weather started to cool. The grapes were in glorious condition, thick skinned, concentrated with a perfect balance of sugar and acidity. The hot weather ensured the stems were also very ripe, an important factor for those vigneronns who favour a degree of whole bunch ferment. It was also important not to force the winemaking process and avoid over extraction, so soft vinification was the order of the day.



2015 - THE WINES

The resulting wines are quite sensational, perfectly balanced with a stunning concentration. The general feeling is that they sit stylistically between 2009 and 2010 and similar to 2005 but with greater fruit concentration. Oh my goodness!

Demand is already extremely high, despite the higher prices this year, due to low yields and of course the exchange rate effect. The devastating frosts that have seriously affected the 2016 vintage will put serious pressures on the availability for top Burgundy in the immediate and medium term, so purchasing En Primeur is more important than ever.

This is a very flattering vintage for the white wines, broad and rich in texture that will offer relatively early, flamboyant drinking. The red wines are destined for greatness showing a richness and concentration rarely seen, with beautiful, ripe and succulent tannins.

Recommending this vintage is a very simple thing to do. A great year for the reds and an excellent one for the whites!

CHABLIS

DOMAINE TESTUT

We have worked closely with Cyril Testut for many years now. Quiet, considered and deeply passionate about his 13ha domaine, he is the proprietor of one of the real jewels of the Chablis region that sits in the top echelons of the Chablis hierarchy.

His Chablis vineyards are perfectly situated - squeezed between the Grand Cru Blanchot and the 1er Cru of Montée de Tonnerre. It is arguably the finest Chablis AC vineyard in the region. Whilst we do not include his Chablis in our En Primeur offer, please do let us know if you are interested.

The small parcel of the famous Grand Cru Grenouilles returned to the Testut family only a few years ago. Back in 1970's the vineyards were leased, due to internal family squabbles, and were held by William Fèvre for 30 years. It is now back in the hands of one of Chablis' finest domaines.

Chablis 1er Cru Montée de Tonnerre

£148.00 per case IB

The vines of this vineyard plot are now 59 years old - all hand harvested and fermented purely in tank and then aged in tank for 16 months. Delicious! An intense, tight bouquet, the palate is screaming with minerality, apple and citrus. A finely structured wine, full of complexity from the region's finest 1er Cru.

Chablis Grand Cru Les Grenouilles (case x 6)

£156.00 per case IB

A small plot of only 0.31 ha planted with 51 year old vines. 83% was fermented in steel tank with the remaining 17% in 600 litre oak barrels. The bouquet is flowery and elegant with only a slight whiff of oak that will integrate over time. The palate



CHABLIS

DOMAINE DES MARRONNIERS

Laurent and Marie-Noëlle Ternynck acquired this lovely domaine from Bernard Legland in 2013. They have invested well and strive for perfection each vintage by expressing the traditional soils of Chablis. The only change in winemaking is the move to using wild yeasts during the fermentation process, thereby elevating the terroir character of Chablis in the wine. This is a super little domaine that produces wines of great typicity.

Produced from 10 different parcels from vines of between 25-30 year old. This is classic Chablis demonstrating a beautiful minerality, very intense with oyster shell freshness.

Produced from South East facing vineyards, this is a tight, well constructed wine. It is always one of our favourite 1er Cru Chablis that always benefits from a little ageing. Intense and concentrated, with an astonishing purity and delicious taut acidity.

CHABLIS

DOMAINE DANIEL DAMPT

This 35ha domaine, of which 13ha are of 1er Cru status, is situated in the village of Milly and is run by Daniel and his two sons, Vincent and Sebastian. They produce a very classic style of Chablis. The 1er Cru Côte de Lêchet is situated on very steep limestone hills with vines averaging 35 years old producing very low yields.

Produced from two parcels - one 15 year old vines and the other 60 year old vines. Pale straw in colour, the palate is rich in tropical fruit with a buttery texture - a high degree of tropical fruit content and almond nut traces give an added dimension.

Chablis 1er Cru Côte de Lêchet

£140.00 per case IB

This steep, South/South East facing vineyard looking over the village of Milly and just above Dampt's home, is set on a stony clay subsoil, has a great aspect and the fruit normally shows a great degree of ripeness and generosity.

This is by far the best 1er Cru from this domaine and one that we follow every year. A lovely ripe bouquet, fine and tight, with zesty lime aromas. The palate is deeply concentrated, with great minerality and a pure, long, fresh finish

MÂCONNAIS

DOMAINE OLIVIER MERLIN

Widely regarded as one of the finest winemakers in Southern Burgundy, Olivier Merlin produces an excellent range of wines from his Mâcon La Roche Vineuse up to the appellation of Pouilly Fuissé and Moulin à Vent.

Situated just north of the village of Fuissé, in La Roche Vineuse, Merlin's wines are characterised by a quite stunning purity and impeccable balance and demonstrate his exceptional winemaking talents from lowly appellations. They are frequently taken for Côte d'Or wines when tasted blind. If you like value for money, look no further.

WHITE

Mâcon La Roche Vineuse

£82.00 per case IB

Produced from vines grown on a compact limestone soil. A small proportion (15%) is fermented in old oak cures to give the wine a 'lift' with the majority fermented in stainless steel.

Mâcon La Roche Vineuse Vieilles Vignes

£114.00 per case IB

Produced from four separate parcels planted in 1922, 1932, 1949 and 1951. Barrel fermented, 10% of which is new, and aged for a further one year in barrel.

DOMAINE ROGER LUQUET

This 26 ha domaine is situated right in the heart of the village of Fuissé. There is no oak ageing at all in the winemaking process whatsoever, which enables Patrick Luquet to produce wines that express both fruit and terroir with no interfering dimensions.

Pouilly Fuissé 'Au Bourg'

£125.00 per case IB

Produced from vines that are at least 56 years old, situated in the Clos just in front of the Church in the centre of the village of Fuissé. This vineyard was initially planted back in 1927 by the Great Grandfather of the current generation, Maurice Luquet. Very impressive this vintage boasting that inimitable purity that is the hallmark of this domaine.

CHALONNAISE

CHATEAU DE CHAMILLY

This property lies in the heart of Mercurey and has been in the hands of the Desfontaine family for over 150 years. The impressive castle boasts a 14th century tower as well as imposing 17th century fortifications.

Now in the hands of Veronique Desfontaine, the 25ha estate is managed by her two sons, Arnaud and Xavier. Major investment over the last few years has been substantial and is ongoing. This is an excellent addition to our portfolio

Montagny 'Les Reculerons'

£115.00 per case IB

The vineyards are perfectly positioned with a south eastern exposure, producing perfect Chardonnay grapes. Fermented in 100% stainless steel, this is a beautiful, fruit packed wine of great purity, a hint of flint and a streaking minerality.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE HUBERT LAMY

Created back in 1973 by Hubert Lamy, this domaine has been run by his son, Olivier, since 1996 following his training at Domaine Meo Camuzet. He immediately introduced the changes that have ultimately elevated this domaine into the higher echelons of Burgundian winemaking.

He ceased selling grapes to negociants and sold off peripheral vineyards to concentrate on the oldest and best sites. High density planting was introduced to glean as much expression of terroir as possible and selection tables were introduced into the cuverie to ensure that only the finest grapes are used. His more recent move to reduce the amount of new oak and the introduction of demi-muids (300-600lt barrels) has also helped to improve the wines at this domaine and resulted in a greater propensity to age.

Olivier adapts his winemaking to the vintage and having learnt lessons from the hot vintages such as 2003 and 2009 decided not to use any new oak in 2015. It is now without doubt one of the star domaines in Burgundy and any quality cellar should contain some wines from Olivier Lamy.

Bourgogne Chardonnay ‘Les Chataigniers’

£150.00 per case IB

Produced from a vineyard that lies on the upper slopes as the hill bends around toward Meursault and away from St Aubin itself. Matured in used and new 600 lt oak barrels (2/3 1 year and 1/3 2 year) to lessen the effects of new oak and to preserve the sense of minerality. A flowery bouquet with citrus notes, the palate is full of apple flavours underpinned by a delicious tangy acidity. A great, affordable entry into this superb domaine.

St Aubin La Princesse

£200.00 per case IB

Although a Village wine Olivier includes a proportion of 1er Cru grapes in the blend to add extra depth and class. Olivier has succeeded in allowing the fruit to express itself with tropical melon, intense and taut, with ripe nectarine fruits and a beautiful minerality.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE HUBERT LAMY

St Aubin 1er Cru Clos du Meix

£258.00 per case IB

The Clos de Meix is a small 0.7ha walled plot of vines overlooking the Southern aspect of the village - the extra warmth of the 'clos' gives a higher degree of richness. The vines were planted in two blocks in 1985 and 1995 on a soil of hard chalk and rock overlaid with large stones. This a wonderful, harmonious wine, full of buttery richness and perfectly balanced.

St Aubin 1er Cru en Remilly

£360.00 per case IB

Produced from 3 separate blocks planted by the Lamy family over the past two generations. This is the finest St Aubin 1er Cru - a steep south facing slope which is effectively a continuation of the famous Grand Cru Le Montrachet. As usual this is a superbly crafted wine and is always one of Lamy's star performers, with the most power and density. Intensely aromatic, bursting with minerality and oozing richness. Great white Burgundy!

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE ETIENNE SAUZET

Gerard Boudot, son-in-law of the late Etienne Sauzet, is one of the star winemakers of this appellation now supported by his daughter Emilie and her husband, Benoit Riffault. This small, 8 hectare, bio-dynamically farmed domaine, produces wines of great definition and style and are highly sought after. The wines are left on their lees for 10 months with 20% new oak for Puligny Village.

Farmed organically since 2006, the family subsequently moved to bio-dynamic status in 2010. The 1er Crus receive between 20% and 33% new oak. They are some of the most sought after wines in the Puligny appellation and are famed for their elegance and intensity.

Bourgogne Blanc Tufera

£153.00 per case IB

Produced from three separate, small parcels of vines. Vinified in 2-3 year old barrels. This is one of the Côte de Beaune's finest Bourgogne Chardonnays and stands equal to many Puligny's! Rich and intense, finely textured with tropical grapefruit characters. A rare opportunity to find excellent value for money!

Drink 2017+

Puligny-Montrachet

£390.00 per case IB

Produced from 12 parcels totalling 3.5ha planted with vines that average 49 years old, the oldest of which was planted in 1934. Vinified in only 15% new oak, green-gold in colour, the bouquet is beautifully expressive and open. The palate is finely crafted with an impressive core acidity supporting the sumptuous ripe fruit.

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Perrières

£785.00 per case IB

The Sauzet estate owns 1.4ha at the heart of the Perrières vineyard with a great aspect and thinner calcareous soil structure, giving long lived wines with great finesse. 20% new oak, picked from 7 different parcels spread around the village. The bouquet is rich and intense, the palate fine, offering layer upon layer of ripe fruits with a complex minerality – A wine of great finesse and grace.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE MESTRE-MICHELOT

Jean-François Mestre assumed control of the vineyards and winemaking at the 22 ha Domaine Michelot in 1993. Mestre, who is married to one of Bernard Michelot's four daughters, has spent the last twenty years raising the profile of this domaine which is now widely regarded as one of the finest in the Meursault appellation. One third new oak is used. The wines benefit from extended contact with the lees and regular battonage, which contributes to their rich and expressive character. To enhance the wines' vivacity, after 12 months the cuvees are assembled into temperature-controlled stainless steel tanks where they complete their maturation over the next 6 months. The estate's entire production now appears under the Domaine Mestre-Michelot label.

Domaine Michelot's vineyard practices aim at maintaining a balanced natural environment. The aim is to encourage the vine's natural resistance mechanisms. They regularly plough the soils and apply compost as opposed to chemical fertilizers. Grass is planted between all the rows to absorb water, thereby creating a condition of mild hydric stress for the wines. This condition serves 3 purposes: it encourages the roots to grow deeper into the soil, enhancing the wine's complexity; it makes for healthier grapes while concentrating their sugar and flavors; and it creates an environment in which vine maladies caused by moisture are naturally prevented.

Meursault (case x 6)

£120.00 per case IB

This wine is now enhanced by grapes from the lieux-dits vineyards of Les Casse Têtes and Limozin, which give an added richness and intensity to the wine. Matured in 15% new oak, a mix of 225lt and 600lt Demi-Muids. A basket of sweet buttery fruit, streaks of honey, lime marmalade and a high degree of tropical richness characterize this wine.

Meursault Clos St Felix

£280.00 per case IB

Named after the small walled vineyard ('Clos') that lies to the front of the estate, this sheltered 0.94ha site enjoys an extra 1 C degree of temperature. A more fulsome style, lush fruit, sweet accompanying oak, cereal and hints of toffee. Oily, rich and generous, this is a powerful wine.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE VOILLOT

This domaine has been producing wine now for five generations, but it is since the present owner, Jean Pierre Charlot, son-in-law of Joseph Voillot, took control that it has moved into the league of serious wine producers.

The domaine consists of 10ha of vineyards, including some prized sites in several 1er Crus. The grapes are partially destemmed and the wines matured in oak barrels (20-35% new) for 12-18 months. Without doubt one of the finest domaines in Volnay, these wines are never heavy or over extracted. They offer the fragrance, charm and beauty so typical of Volnay.

Bourgogne Pinot Noir

£150.00 per case IB

Covering approximately 2 hectares, the vineyards are situated on the lower slopes in the village of Volnay. The vines average 36 years old, planted in the lieu-dits of Longbois, Luret, Petits Prés and Grandes Terres. Aged in one to 4 year old barrels for 12 months. A rich Pinot Noir - the palate boasts a stunning red fruit intensity with a soft velvety feel.

Produced from 'vieilles vignes' with an average 40 years old. This is beautiful Volnay. Aged for 14 months in 20% new oak. A lovely, elegant wine brimming with raspberry, plum, violets. The palate has a beautiful gourmand feel with overtones of woodsmoke.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE VOILLOT

Pommard

£295.00 per case IB

Produced from four parcels—Cras, Poisots, Saussilles and Vaumuriens, totaling 1.2 ha, with the vines averaging 54 years old. A classic Pommard, red fruit dominant, rich, with a crème de mur intensity and deep core. The tannins are deliciously ripe.

Drink 2023+

Volnay 1er Cru Fremiets

£495.00 per case IB

Situated to the eastern extremities of the appellation adjacent to Pommard on chalk subsoil. Produced from 60 year old vines and aged for 14 months in 25% new oak, this vintage shows Fremiets in a very expressive light. A perfumed bouquet of wild red berries, the palate is expansive, intense and succulent with a beautiful, precise finish.

Drink 2024+

Volnay 1er Cru Champans

£495.00 per case IB

Aged in 25% new oak for 14 months, this is a brooding and powerful Volnay, intense with cassis, raspberry and impressive minerality. A multi-dimensional wine, perfectly framed with a deep and complex core. Outstanding this vintage.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE CAMUS BRUCHON

Savigny-lès-Beaune is a happy hunting ground for red Burgundy lovers who appreciate value as well as quality. Lucien Camus, along with his son Guillaume, produces arguably the finest wines in the Savigny-lès-Beaune Appellation at his 9ha domaine, blessed with a high percentage of old vines.

Meticulous and thoughtful, Lucien is very wary of the amount of new oak used when making his wines, limiting it to no more than 25%. His wines are delightful, perfumed with a delicious elegance and firm, yet refined structure. They are bottled unfiltered in order to preserve the natural balance of fruit and tannins and offer great value.

Savigny-lès-Beaune, La Reine Joly

£180.00 per case IB

Produced from three separate parcels with vines up to 60 years old. Fermented in tank and aged for 18 months in 2nd and 3rd fill barrels, this wine is juicy and overflowing with crunchy, ripe red fruits. The tannins are super ripe this vintage. A lovely wine that will give great pleasure at an affordable price.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

DOMAINE GUY AMIOT

Domaine Guy Amiot's work springs from a long tradition begun in the 1920s under the direction of founder Arsène Amiot. Arsène started acquiring parcels in Chassagne in the 1920s and under his direction Domaine Amiot became one of the first domaines in Burgundy to bottle their own wines.

By the time Guy Amiot took over in 1985, the domaine had built up very impressive holdings and had passed the knowledge of how to best care for the vines down from generation to generation. Their work in the vineyards is exemplary and has led to a solid consistency in the wines.

Guy's sons Thierry and Fabrice are now running the domaine and are taking it to the very top level. The wines of this domaine age particularly well, largely due to the serious acidity and minerality that so epitomise them when tasting from barrel.

Chassagne-Montrachet Vieilles Vignes

£295.00 per case IB

This wine is produced from 12 different parcels totalling 1ha from vines aged between 20 and 45 years old. Aged in 30% new oak for 12 months followed by 6 months in cuve, this is a beautiful, rich and fleshy wine but well supported by a good acidity.

Domaine Tollot-Beaut was the first domaine to bottle its own wines back in 1921 when most growers simply sold their wines to the local negociants, and it has retained its ground breaking ethos to the present day. Under the meticulous control of Natalie Tollot, 5th generation, this 24ha domaine has a unique style that suits the Chorey Appellation perfectly.

The harvest in 2015 was very short and completed in only eight days. Whilst the production was down by 30%, the wines are concentrated and powerful and will offer great drinking. All wines completed the same elevage regime, regardless of appellations - 16 months in barrel before being bottled the following January, with the proportion of new oak varied to suit each individual wine. A great range of wines have been produced at this domaine this vintage.

Bourgogne Pinot Noir (case x 6)

Produced from vines that are planted a stones throw from the Chorey appellation, this is a super little wine that will give immense pleasure. A super entry to this domaine very much in the Tollot style. Rich, soft and easy cherry fruits, beautiful and elegant.

Very little new oak is used, only around 5%, with barrels between 2 and 5 years preferred. The style is alluring, complex and harmonious and is exactly what one looks for in great Volnay.

These wines are hand crafted, with old vines and low yields central to his winemaking philosophy. A cool ten day maceration helps create a stunning richness and concentration with the diligent use of new oak and the non-filtration of his wines being key to the Sérafin style. They destem 70% of the bunches. The grapes are fermented at a relatively high temperature and enjoy 50% new oak ageing.

Despite a gut-wrenching 50% loss in production in 2015 due to heat stress, Charles Lachaux's excitement and enthusiasm in the changes he has implemented are infectious. He is the epitome of the new generation of Burgundian winemaker; inquisitive, talented and determined.

Even though it was a hot year, the lack of heat spikes meant the grapes were able to develop thick skins thus avoiding sunburn. The viticultural changes Charles has instigated means he has had to double the number of workers in the vineyard. The result is more balanced, healthy fruit, better retention of acidity and a higher pulp to juice ratio giving more density of flavour.

The wines were undoubtedly glowing with a purity and energy which made them utterly compelling. The ripeness of the vintage has allowed for a far higher percentage of whole bunch, with 70-100% being employed adding structure, freshness and perfume to the wine. This style has been complemented by Charles' philosophy of reducing the amount of new oak in the wines to a maximum of 40% from the traditional 100%. This has resulted in beautifully seductive, fresh and supple wines.

Bourgogne Pinot Fin

Produced from three separate parcels, 50% Chambolle, 25% Nuits and 25% Vosne, from vines that are between 50-60 years old. 50% fermented in 2 year fill barrels with the remaining 50% in stainless steel. A glorious and welcoming wine with a bright perfumed nose of black cherries enhanced by 80% whole bunch fermentation. The palate is silken and deliciously voluptuous while the signature freshness is enhanced by a subtle grip and delicate spice. Long, concentrated and generous.

The structure, as expected for 2015 is ripe yet taut with a lovely chalky mineral note enhancing the freshness on the long, vibrant finish. It is a perfectly orchestrated symphony of flavour.

Echezeaux (case x 6)

This Grand Cru lies adjacent to the Grand Cru Chambertin. The Lachaux own two small plots totaling 0.53ha, with vines up to 60 years old. On the palate the wine boasts breadth and depth adding weight to the gorgeously pure, silken red and black cherry fruit with its subtle hints of roses. The palate is textural with a chalky mineral core, it has effortlessly supple tannins and a nervy acidity which combine to make this an utterly compelling wine.

Located at the very south of the appellation, fifty meters from Domaine Romanée Conti. The soil is dark clay and the 0.34 plot is ploughed by horse. The average age of the vines is over 90 years old. The palate by contrast is a mesmeric display of deep, concentrated ripe fruit with darker wild red berries and plums, rose petals and a complex hint of exotic garam masala. The family owns small parcels in several different appellations and manages to seduce the individual characteristics from each one.

This estate now uses a blend of American and French oak, developing a unique style in the appellation of Nuits-St-George, Gevrey-Chambertin and Pommard.

WHITE

Puligny-Montrachet Les Houillères

£215.00 per case IB

A 2/3 ha plot purchased a number of years ago from Louis Chavy, this wine always provides excellent value for money and punches way above its price tag. Fermented and aged in 50% new oak for ten months. A delicious bouquet of citrus and peach with a little hint of toast. The palate is rich in pineapple and honey but finely balanced by the classic steeliness of this appellation.

Nuits St Georges Blanc, Les Creux Fraiche Eau

DOMAINE JEAN GRIVOT

Along with Domaine Tollot Beaudouin this 15 ha domaine was one of the first to bottle its own wines, back in the 1930's. It is now in the hands of the 5th generation, Etienne Grivot, who produces some of the most classic wines in the whole of Burgundy, with an average vine age of around 45 - 50 years old. His motto is simple! "Wine is a therapy – you need to feel better after it than before!"

Etienne has some great raw materials to work with. He destems 95% and stops the practice of 'pigeage' as soon as the fermentation starts, continuing with one 'pumping over' the skins per day before the ferment stops and the wines are transferred to barrel. He uses 30% new oak for village wines, 40-50% new oak for 1er Cru and up to 70% new oak for his Grand Cru's.

Etienne says 2015 was one of the most harmonious vintages he has produced. The fruit shows not only charm and glamour but an incredible saline acidity that promises energy and longevity. The very dry summer did result in a reduction in yield but it also delayed the phenolic ripening of the grapes. Whilst many other growers started to harvest on the 2nd September, Etienne delayed until 10th September to ensure perfectly ripe stems, pips and skins.

The seductive nature of the wines he attributes to a combination of delaying his harvest, and the gradual changes he has made to managing the tannin profile of the wines in the cellar. He eschews whole bunch fermentations but firmly believes that the quality of the de-stemmer, which leaves the berries whole, is vital in the final quality of the wine. This gives all the benefits of whole bunch but none of the drawbacks. A stunning vintage at this domaine.

Coteaux Bourguignons (casex6)

£78.00 per case IB

Produced from 61 year old Gamay vines in Flagey- Echezeaux, the grapes were 100% de-stemmed prior to fermentation. This has nothing to do with Beaujolais! Rich black fruits, a hint of spice balanced by a lovely fragrant freshness.
