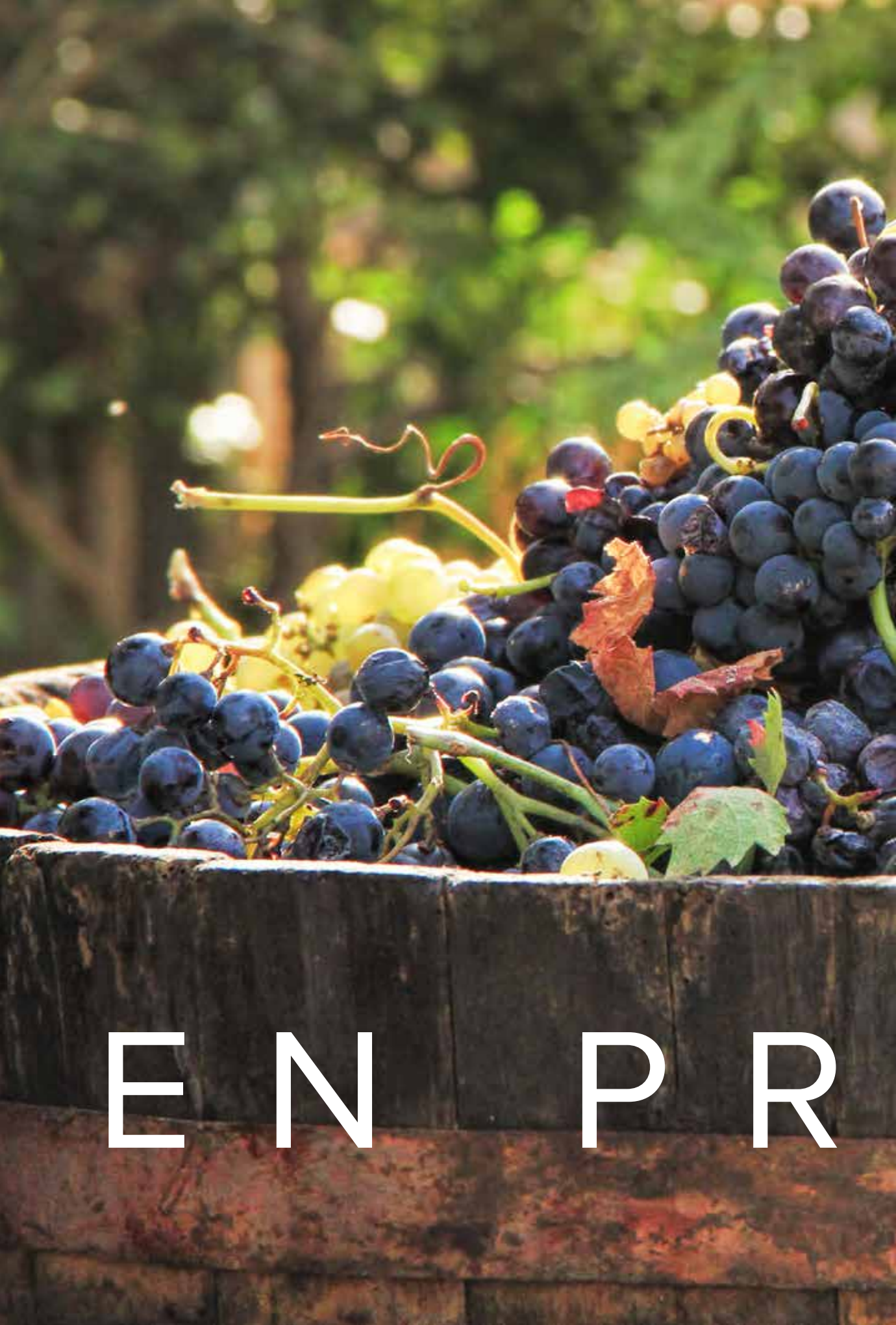

HARVEST REPORT 2020

Over the past twenty years, there has been a winemaking revolution in the wine growing regions of the South of France. Once home to the European wine lake, the Languedoc-Roussillon has been transformed into one of the most exciting and innovative wine producing regions, not only in France, but the entire world. It is now the source of some fantastic, individual, single and mixed varietal wines, produced by innovative and passionate winemakers, who exploit the individual terroirs of the many regions from Perpignan in the west to St Tropez in the east.

In 2020 the weather conditions were very favourable, a welcome relief from the previous year when temperature records were smashed and a high of 45.9°C was registered in the Languedoc. The winter rains were essential to revitalising the soils after a gruelling hot and dry growing season in 2019. The cool and dry weather continued into Spring time but with no negative effects such as rot or millerandage.

The summer months were hot and dry, but without the extreme heat spikes of the previous vintage. The good reserves of rain in the soils and the cool nights helped maintain freshness and acidity. Indeed there was a full 10°C between night and day temperatures.

The resulting wines are delicious, brimming with fresh fruits, full of harmony and silky tannins. A wonderful, balanced vintage whose wines ooze elegance and finesse.

PIERRE CROS (BADENS)

“ I neither pretend to teach you how you should taste my wines... nor when... or why... or (even worse) with whom. I would just like to outline certain reflexions and ideas, which in my opinion are important for today's wine world. I would like to tell you, for example, that above all I am a peasant, a hillbilly if you like, with all my knowledge and all my doubts. And I am surely a full man, proud about his roots and proud to rrrrole the R's like people do in my country. ”

Pierre Cros, an ex rugby player, is a genuine maverick winemaker from the Languedoc wine region. Above all he is a great character. He refuses to pay for any official organic or biodynamic certification simply to prove how he has always farmed his domaine. Respecting the terroir and environment in which he works has always been central to his thinking. Above all, he holds a healthy disdain for the bureaucracies that challenge his free spirit.

His domaine is situated in the small village of Badens in the Minervois, surrounded by the Canal du Midi to the South and the Montagne Noire to the North. It is here in the intense heat of the southern sun that little else grows except the vine and olive tree...and it is here that Pierre Cros cultivates his 20 hectares of vines including the classic Southern French varieties of Grenache, Carignan and Syrah as well as some very interesting Touriga Nacional and Nebbiolo.


Low yields and vines dating from 1905 contribute to the production of some extremely fascinating and popular wines which are deep and structured and very enjoyable.



'Les Rocs' 2020, Vin de France

A very unusual blend of Nebbiolo, Touriga Nacional, Pinot Noir and Grenache Noir. (25% of each varietal) Vinified separately in 35hl oak foudres followed by 5 months ageing. Of course, neither Nebbiolo nor Touriga Nacional are permitted varietals in the Minervois appellation and so this wine is sold as 'Vin de France'. Pierre shrugs his shoulders and says "La liberté n'est pas de faire ce que l'on veut, mais de vouloir ce que l'on fait." (Freedom is not doing what we want, but wanting to do what we're doing). He loves to quote the famous French author Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet.

The bouquet is soft and aromatic with whiffs of jam compote. Easy, accessible and stylish. The palate is smooth with the Touriga Nacional providing a core intensity, a lovely spicy garrigue is derived from the Grenache Noir, whilst the freshness and acidity of the Nebbiolo and the fragrance of the Pinot Noir provide a stunning balance. The tannins are super fine and the length of finish long and intense.

'Le Barthas', 2020 Minervois

A lieux-dit vineyard, the blend is 2/3 Syrah and 1/3 Mourvèdre, fermented in tank. A wine of real character, produced from exceptionally poor soils that force the vines to work hard and penetrate deep underground. The palate is succulent and rich in raspberry fruit. A wet stone minerality, soft tannins and overtones of garrigue, provide a wonderful herb backdrop, whilst a hint of cinnamon lingers on the finish.

"Entre la vigne et la mer, entre ma mère et mon père, entre Syrah and Mourvèdre, non pas les raisins de colère mais les raisins de l'amour."


(Between the vine and the sea, between my Mother and my Father, between Syrah and Mourvedre, not the grapes of anger but the grapes of love.....) – Pierre Cros.

Minervois Vieilles Vignes 2020


This wine is produced from 95% Carignan vines planted in 1905, with the remaining 5% a mixed field blend. Aged in 2 year old oak barrels, used the previous vintage for the prestige Les Aspres, for 5-6 months. An element of carbonic maceration enhances the aromatics. Brimming with black fruit characters, concentrated cassis and a black cherry freshness, this is a superb wine, tightly knit and supported by firm, suave tannins. There is also a beautiful, refined streak of garrigue that sits deep within the skeleton of the wine. Complex and oozing finesse.

Les Mal Aimés 2020, Vin de France

Literally translated as "The Unloved"! This wine is produced from the forgotten and unfashionable grapes found in the Languedoc-Roussillon – a blend of Aramon, Picpoul Noir, Alicante Bouschet, Morrastel, Rivairenc and Carignan. The sum of the parts is greater than the whole, with these overlooked varieties coming together and producing a symphony of flavours. Pierre seduces the very best from each varietal with loving care, producing a wine laden with cherry fruits, dried apricots and beautiful fine-tuned tannins. A touch of garigue and spice completes the palate. Long and lingering in the mouth with a delicious sour cherry, mouth watering finish.

Les Aspres 2020, Minervois

The prestige wine from this domaine, produced from 100% Syrah and aged in 100% new oak for 14 months. This is Minervois at its very best.

Big, rich and powerful, the concentration is enhanced by the extremely low yields. There is a density of black fruits that envelop the broad, luxurious and sumptuous palate, with polished tannins and a harmonious and lengthy finish. An absolute cracker!

LES VIGNOBLES BRUNIER (BÉDARRIDES)

As well as producing the famous Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe, the Bruniers also produce a couple of superb wines from more minor appellations – “our everyday house wines!” quips Daniel Brunier. Some house wine!! They offer a great insight into the Brunier winemaking style at an affordable price.



Le Pigeolet des Brunier 2020, Vaucluse


This wine is a blend of 80% Grenache Noir, 10% Syrah, 5% Carignan, 5% Cinsault, produced from two separate vineyards. The first is a 7ha parcel in the municipality of Caromb in the Côtes de Ventoux, while the second is a 3ha vineyard situated right on the boundary of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. The average age of the vines is 25 years old. The grapes are picked by hand and fully destemmed. 50% of the wine underwent its malolactic fermentation in large oak foudres with the remainder in stainless steel tank. The final blend was then aged for a further six months in foudres. Rammed with ripe fruits with an interlacing of wild herbs, this is an immensely gluggable glass of red and delivers stupendous value for money.

Mégaphone des Brunier 2020, Ventoux

Produced from a single plot in the area of Caromb, nestling on the southern slopes of the Dentelles de Montmirail. It is a little paradise. Just three hectares of vines, but their situation and aspect prompted the Bruniers not to include these grapes in the classic Pigeolet blend and instead to make a wine in its own right. The vines are 25 years old on average, harvesting is by hand and the grapes are de-stemmed before being gently pressed. Vinification in temperature controlled cement cuves for 15 to 20 days. The wine goes through a full malolactic fermentation and is then aged in huge (50 hectolitre) oak vats for 10 months. A blend of 80% Grenache and 20% Syrah, Rhone Valley enthusiasts will be delighted with this rich, earthy wine. Filled with black cherry fruits, it is beautifully balanced by a fresh spiciness on the finish.

RHÔNE VALLEY

HARVEST REPORT 2020

It seems that the Rhône Valley is on an unstoppable run of excellent vintages, now reaching back to the outstanding 2015. In terms of consistency, quality and, dare I say availability, it is arguably the 'go to' of the great red wine producing regions in France at the moment.

The basis of every vintage is the winter months following the previous vintage. The Rhone Valley suffers drought on a regular basis, so the wet winter of 2019 was very welcome. The high rainfall replenished and regenerated the soils, so important when you consider that there was a rainfall deficit throughout the 2020 growing season.

Spring passed without any frost damage, and the warm and dry summer was notable for the lack of extreme heat that is normally associated with this region, producing wines of a different style to the very hot 2019 vintage. Indeed, the days enjoyed cooling winds and the temperatures cooled noticeably during the summer nights. The vines could also draw on the water from the winter rains. This resulted in acidities rather higher than usual, providing an attractive freshness to the wines, as well as alcohol levels more restrained than in previous years.

The growers were delighted. Another excellent vintage with wines full of energy, freshness and balance, rich fruit intensity and suave polished tannins.


DOMAINE DU TUNNEL

Stéphane Robert has moved his wine-making operations from a small cellar in Saint Péray up into the hills above the town where the old railway tunnel that gives the domaine its name is the perfect environment for vinification and élevage. The ambient temperature never rises above 15°C even in the height of summer and there is plenty of natural humidity. After a glorious, warm and sunny summer, the first white grapes were picked on 28th August.

Saint Péray 'Cuvée Prestige' 2020

A blend of 80% Marsanne and 20% Roussanne from the lower slopes towards the village of Cornas. Vinified and aged for 8 months in 4 year-old oak barrels.

The bouquet is overt with conspicuous aromas of ripe and rich stone fruits. The palate is succulent, pears and melon fruits meander along the tongue with a soft and soothing acid balance. A lovely, concentrated wine, deep in flavour showing vitality and impressive on the finish. A little age will only enhance its complexity

DOMAINE YANN CHAVE (MERCUROL - TAIN-L'HERMITAGE)

Yann Chave joined his father Bernard at the family winery in 1996 and swiftly set about expanding and improving the estate. Today, the domaine extends over 20 hectares, including 1.15 hectares on the hill of Hermitage itself, and is certified organic in its entirety. Vinification is meticulous. The fruit is 100% destemmed and then fermented and macerated for 20-25 days in stainless steel vats, followed by ageing for 9-12 months in either stainless steel or 650 litre oak casks. After a hot, generally dry summer but with sufficient rain from time to time, the 2020 red harvest ran from 6th to 12th September in perfect conditions. Alcohol levels were on average 1% lower than in 2019 and the wines are fresher and more elegant as a result. These are superb, rich, characterful wines that Yann considers to be amongst the very best that he has made during his 25 years at the estate.

Crozes-Hermitage 2020


A characterful, complex blend of fruit from vineyards in both the northern and southern sectors of the appellation. The average age of the vines is now over 25 years and this is a rich, generous example of creamy, ripe Syrah. Carefully extracted tannins give fine structure. A lovely, complete Crozes that is already delicious to drink but will age gracefully.

Drink: 2023+

Crozes-Hermitage 'Le Rouvre' 2020


From the domaine's finest plot of 60 year old vines in the Chassis sector in the south of the appellation towards the River Isère. This dense, concentrated wine is aged for 12 months in 1, 2 and 3 year old 650 litre oak barrels from tonnelleres Taransaud and Seguin-Moreau. Wonderfully aromatic with notes of blackberry and spice. As good as many producer's Hermitage and wonderful value.

Hermitage 2020

Yann owns 1.15 hectares on the hill of Hermitage in two lieux-dits (Beaume and Peleat), both in the central part of the appellation. Aged in 100% new, 650 litre demi-muids principally from Taransaud as Yann feels their barrels are best suited to rich, concentrated vintages. Impressive depth and structure with fine, gamey fruit, a dense, close-knit texture and an amazingly long aftertaste.

DOMAINE COMBIER (TAIN-L'HERMITAGE)


If you love pure, unadulterated, concentrated Syrah, look no further. We have followed this domaine for many years after a successful buying trip to the Rhône Valley and Laurent Combiér's wines have proved immensely popular. 2015 was an outstanding vintage at this domaine.

The modern winery, built in 1990, is situated on the busy N7 between Tain-l'Hermitage and Pont de l'Isère. It is here that Laurent Combiér, a very practical, open minded winemaker produces his lush exuberant and rich style of wine. Farmed organically, his 13 hectares of vineyards are situated on the 'Les Chassis' plateau.



Crozes-Hermitage 'Clos des Grives', 2020

Produced from a 9 ½ hectare Clos (walled vineyard) this is Laurent Combiér's top cuvée. The oldest 4 hectares of the Clos are planted with vines that date back to 1952 and yield very small quantities. Aged for 12 months in oak casks, of which 40% are new. A very intense and concentrated wine, compact with lush cassis fruit that dominates the palate. The tannins are suave and polished, and there is a wonderful freshness that expands the finish perfectly. This is the very pinnacle of Crozes-Hermitage.

DOMAINE DU VIEUX TÉLÉGRAPHE (BÉDARRIDES)

One of the famous names of Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe is the jewel in the Brunier family's winemaking crown. The estate consists of some 70 hectares of vines, with 65 hectares of red grapes (60% Grenache, 15% Syrah, 15% Mourvèdre and 10% other) and 5 hectares of white (30% Grenache Blanc, 40% Clairette, 15% Roussanne and 15% Bourboulenc). The vineyards lie in a single block on the La Crau plateau. The major contributing factors to the personality of the wines of Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe are the enormous stones (galets) covering the property to an average depth of six inches.

These stones, in summer as well as winter, limit the evaporation of the soil whilst also playing their role of thermal accumulators, reducing considerably the changes of temperature between night and day. The average vine's age is rigorously maintained at over 40 years, by replanting on an ongoing basis. Each parcel of vines is given careful attention in terms of pruning and the spreading of organic fertiliser and traditional ploughing. Similarly, de-budding, carried out by hand, and the removal of surplus unripe grapes and leaves, enables each vine to obtain its own balance. Harvesting is carried out by hand and sorted twice so that the healthiest fruit possible is received at the winery.

Télégramme 2020

The Domaine's second wine is produced in a very different way to “La Crau”. The grapes are fully destemmed before traditional 12-day fermentation in temperature controlled stainless steel tanks. A period of 9 months ageing in concrete tanks is followed by 6 months in oak foudres. The blend is bolstered by the addition of grapes from 45 year old vines of Château La Roquette, Vieux Télégraphe's sister property.

The immediate bouquet offers very ripe red fruits, verging on strawberry jam, more direct and immediate than the Grand Vin. On the palate it has that balance between liveliness and velvet, the slight sucrosity specific to Grenache presents itself perfectly, but doesn't weigh the wine down at all. It has length without being overly complex, peppery but rounded too. This is a classic Télégramme! Drink while you wait for “La Crau” to age.

Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe “La Crau” 2020

Produced from vineyards located on the stony plateau of La Crau in the south east of the appellation, where the villages of Bédarrides and Courthézon meet. The vines average 70 years of age and the vineyard is the hottest in Châteauneuf-du-Pape.

The grapes are hand-picked, with double sorting at the vine, then a third sorting in the winery. Gentle pressing and selective destemming, followed by 30-40 days' traditional fermentation in temperature-controlled stainless-steel and wooden vats. Pneumatic pressing, then systematic malolactic fermentation. The wine is matured for 20-22 months in French oak foudres (60hl). Bottled unfinned and unfiltered.

A blend of 65% Grenache Noir, 15% Mourvèdre, 15% Syrah, Cinsault, Clairette and sundry others 5%. The colour is dark blood red/purple. The bouquet is immediate, full and inviting, with notes of crushed black fruits, Myrtle, cherry and a dusting of sweet spice, with a savoury note of Garrigue and roasted herbs. The palate is full, spicy and layered with jammy red and black fruits, warm earth, spice and a powerful black pepper note that holds the sweet fruit in check. The tannins are plush, almost sensual, and the wine holds its poise and balance incredibly well. It is a big wine, but almost invitingly approachable now, typical of the high Grenache content, and the finish is incredibly long.

DOMAINE LES PALLIÈRES (GIGONDAS)

Domaine Les Pallières, nestling in the foothills of the beautiful and brooding Dentelles de Montmirail, is undeniably one of the greatest, longest-running properties of the Southern Rhône. The vineyards range from 250-400 meters in altitude, with varying proportions of sand and clay interwoven with limestone scree descending from the Dentelles.

When the Brunier family purchased the domaine back in 1998 this great property had fallen on hard times. Years of painstaking work in the vineyards followed. Terraces were built and reinforced, allowing for better water retention. A new winery was built to receive the harvested parcels individually in gravity fed tanks. Finally, as the Bruniers began to fully understand the vineyards at Pallières, the many lieux-dits, once blended into one cuvée of Gigondas, were separated into two, starting with the 2007 vintage, in an effort to best express two remarkable personalities.


Cuvée “Terrasse du Diable,” encompasses the low-yielding vines from the higher altitudes that express great structure and intense minerality. Cuvée “Les Racines” showcases the vineyard parcels surrounding the winery - the origin of the domaine with the oldest vines -with the emphasis on freshness and extravagant cornucopian fruit.



Gigondas ‘Les Racines’ 2020

Produced from old vines (70 – 100 years old) around the Domaine house. The grapes are handpicked and partially destemmed before fermentation in concrete and oak tanks. After a period of ten months ageing in concrete vats, the wine is aged in large oak foudres for a period of ten months. It is then bottled without filtration. The blend comprises 80% Grenache, 15% Syrah-Cinsault complantés, 5% Clairette.

Dark and deep in the glass, much darker than the Terrasse. The nose is immediate, full and brooding with a powerful kick of concentrated black fruits, roasted coffee and a baked earth quality that seems almost feral and animalistic. The palate is powerful, robust and grips well, the fruit is concentrated, almost jammy, but overlaid with savoury notes of Crème de Mure, black olive, cracked pepper, wild herbs and liquorice. The flavour profile is like an assault, broodingly rich, dark and full, with sinew and muscle overlaid across the extremely ripe fruit. The tannins are big, rounded and plush yet in balance with the concentrated fruit and freshness, giving the impression of power and elegance in perfect balance. A wine of great complexity.

Gigondas ‘Terrasse du Diable’ 2020

The grapes are grown on terraces in the most northerly reaches of the appellation, in the lieux-dits of Poncet, Thomas, Les Pallières and Terrasse du Diable, at an altitude of 250-400 metres. Most are small, isolated plots surrounded by woodland.

Produced in exactly the same way as its sister wine, the only difference being its terroir. A blend of 90% Grenache and 5% Mourvèdre, 5% Cinsault. The grapes are grown on the higher altitude terraced vineyards, handpicked and partially destemmed, before fermentation in concrete and oak tanks. After a period of ten months ageing in concrete vats, the wine is aged in large oak foudres for a period of ten months. It is then bottled without filtration.

A warm, integrated and generous wine, showing bright red and some purple notes in the glass. The nose is full and forward, showing high levels of ripeness and sweet red fruits, layered with wet stones, some menthol and a sprinkling of roasted herbs and coffee. The palate is full, generous, and warm, again with layers of creamy red and black fruits, coffee, roasted meat and a generous spicy character and the tannins are almost silky, enveloping the sweet red fruit core, spice with the oak very much in the background. The finish is long, warm and even, with an almost brooding quality that seems to build rather than melt away. A stony streak of minerality and a lick of freshness complete this wonderful wine.

CHÂTEAU DE BEAUCASTEL (COURTHÉZON)

Run by the Perrin family, Château de Beaucastel is one of the most important in the Châteauneuf-du-Pape appellation and was one of the first to practise organic viticulture – no herbicides, insecticides or any other chemical. It is now farmed according to bio-dynamic principles, using all 13 permitted grape varieties in its final blend with the Mourvèdre variety being the most important properties, often accounting for a third of the final blend. The vinification process is rather interesting in that when the grapes arrive at the winery, they are heated rapidly in order to extract colour and aroma, whilst also killing bacteria. This is known as “à chaud” and is not widely used. After maturation in large oak foudres the wine is bottled with a light fining but without filtration. When mature, the wines of Château de Beaucastel are quite spellbinding. A true “wine experience”.




Coudoulet de Beaucastel 2020

Produced from vineyards just across the Route N7 from the Châteauneuf-du-Pape vineyards of Château de Beaucastel, this wine makes a mockery of its Côtes du Rhône appellation.

A blend of 40% Grenache, 30% Mourvèdre, 20% Syrah, 10% Cinsault. The Syrah and Mourvèdre varieties are fermented in oak to avoid reduction, with the Cinsault and Grenache fermented in concrete tanks. Aged for 6 months in large oak foudres.

The Coudoulet de Beaucastel Côtes du Rhône 2020 is highly impressive. The bouquet is fresh and scented, overt with a wonderful whiff of red fruits. The palate is rich, filled with liquorice, a hint of garrigue and a melange of red fruits – raspberry, strawberry, plums. The palate is balanced with very soft tannins and a streaky acidity that delivers a vibrant freshness.

Château de Beaucastel 2020

This is one of the iconic domaines of Châteauneuf-du-Pape, one which includes all 13 permitted grape varieties.

The grapes are handpicked, carefully sorted and then destemmed, before vinification in temperature controlled vats for 15 days. Each of the 13 varieties are vinified separately before blending. The final blend is then matured in 500hl/ha oak foudres and bottled without filtration.

Beaucastel 2020 is a complete wine. Aromatic and perfumed on the bouquet, flower scent and dark ripe fruits. The palate is very rich and concentrated with cassis and liquorice fruits, a wonderful texture, velvety and supported by finely grained tannins. A wine that oozes both power and finesse.

Drink: 2028 +
