Château Cantemerle is one of the most popular and consistent classified estates in the Haut-Médoc, widely admired for offering excellent value at the 5th Growth level. The estate has a strong track record of overperforming its 1855 classification, delivering wines that often feel more refined and complete than its rank might suggest. Stylistically, it produces a very classic Bordeaux claret, combining ripe blackcurrant fruit with cedar, tobacco and a fresh, lifted structure that gives precision and energy. A major recent evolution is the completion of its new winery, designed to enhance parcel by parcel vinification and overall precision. The 2025 vintage is the first to be produced in this new facility, marking an important step in Cantemerle's ongoing qualitative refinement.

Tasting Notes:

An appealing, deeply glossy colour, opaque and thick in the glass. The bouquet is suave with fresh, uplifted aromas of ripe black cherries, followed by a succulent palate of cassis, plum and a note of espresso coffee. Dense, well structured, it is sweet in the mid palate and elegant on the finish, the tannins are softly textured and svelte. There is a naturally high refreshing acidity from the Cantemerle terroir along with a subtle, but notable hint of graphite and pencil lead. A great first vintage at their new winery.
