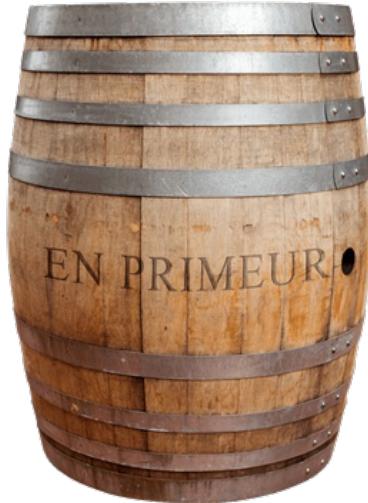
### Château Mouton Rothschild 2024 1er Cru Pauillac 6 x 75cl

This is a powerfully concentrated Mouton, with intense cassis on the nose, hints of violet, and a touch of graphite. On the palate, it is dense and opulent, with layered fruit, velvety tannins, and a long, refined finish. A standout of the 2024 vintage.

#### Tasting Notes:

The 2024 vintage was harvested between 23rd September and 5th October, with only 44.5% of the crop selected for the Grand Vin. The blend is dominated by Cabernet Sauvignon, contributing to a wine of striking structure and depth, essential for a vintage considered lighter in overall weight. The wine will be aged entirely in new oak. This is a powerfully concentrated Mouton, with intense cassis on the nose, hints of violet, and a touch of graphite. On the palate, it is dense and opulent, with layered fruit, velvety tannins, and a long, refined finish. A standout of the 2024 vintage. Drink 2033-2045.

| <b>Producer Overview</b> | Château Mouton Rothschild dates back to the 1730's. In 1853 Baron Nathaniel de Rothschild bought the vineyard of Mouton in the Medoc and it was re-named Mouton Rothschild. It was classified as a second growth wine until 1973 when it was promoted to first growth status. The wines stand out from other Bordeaux wines as for each vintage, a well-known artist is commissioned to design a new label, making the wine very collectable. The vineyards total 75 hectares producing around 25,000 cases with plantings of 80% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot. |
