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# Château Talbot 2025, 4ème Cru Classé, Saint-Julien 6x75cl

One of the most sought after En Primeur châteaux, renowned for producing wines that consistently embody the classic character of Saint-Julien. Classified as 4th Growth in the historic 1855 Bordeaux Classification, the château sits on the gravel rich soils of the Médoc near the Gironde estuary. Owned by the Cordier family since 1918, the estate has built a reputation for reliability, balance, and elegant structure year on year. Its vineyards span more than 100 hectares, allowing the château to craft wines of remarkable consistency and depth. The style of Talbot is refined, expressive and unmistakably true to its appellation.

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### Tasting Notes:

A smouldering, deep bouquet suggesting restrained power leads to a palate that is rich, powerful and tightly knit. Laden with cassis fruits, there is a streak of slate and graphite and a raspberry freshness providing a beautiful balance. An underlays of forest floor typicity, finely integrated oak and ripe tannins provide added complexity. A very good result at Talbot this vintage.
