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# Domaine de Chevalier Blanc 2025, Pessac-Léognan 6x75cl

Domaine de Chevalier, a flagship estate of Pessac-Léognan in Bordeaux's Graves region, has been run by the Bernard family since 1983. Olivier Bernard has overseen its transformation into one of the appellation's most consistently highly regarded Classified Growths. Today, he is joined by his sons, Adrien and Hugo, who help carry forward the estate's family driven vision. The château is renowned for producing refined, age worthy red and white wines that combine precision, depth, and elegance. Its reputation is built on meticulous vineyard work, low yields, and a strong commitment to sustainable viticulture.

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### Tasting Notes:

A floral and aromatic Chevalier with a lovely rich core of peach, apple, citrus and cut grass, overlaid with intense minerality and bracing acidity. The oak is integrated and richly toned, adding weight and vanilla notes, as well as subtle spice and a note of honey and cereal. Complex, long and perfectly balanced.
